As we look at enrollment over the past few years, you can see that CCA has experienced significant growth across nearly every grade level.

6th Grade has grown steadily, from 71 students in 2022–23 to 117 this year.

7th Grade also shows strong growth, increasing from 75 students to 117 currently.

8th Grade had a peak at 103 in 2023–24 and is now at 101, maintaining strong numbers.

In the high school grades, growth has been especially notable:

9th Grade increased from 32 students in 2022–23 to 96 this year.

10th Grade grew from 20 to 84 students in the same period.

11th Grade, which started small at 22 students in 2023–24, is now at 85.

12th Grade, introduced in 2024–25, currently has 32 students.

Overall, total enrollment has jumped from 267 students in 2022–23 to 633 students this year, which is more than doubling our student population in just a few years.

This growth reflects both our community's confidence in CCA and the demand for the

high-quality education we provide.

This table compares Central Carolina Academy's academic performance with other schools in the region.

CCA earned a B grade with a score of 76, 7 points above the growth standard, and a growth value of 4.34, which places us in the Exceeded growth category. This indicates strong academic progress across our student population.

Looking at our peers:

Several schools, like Ascend Leadership Academy and East Lee Middle, are Not Met on growth, with lower scores and negative growth values.

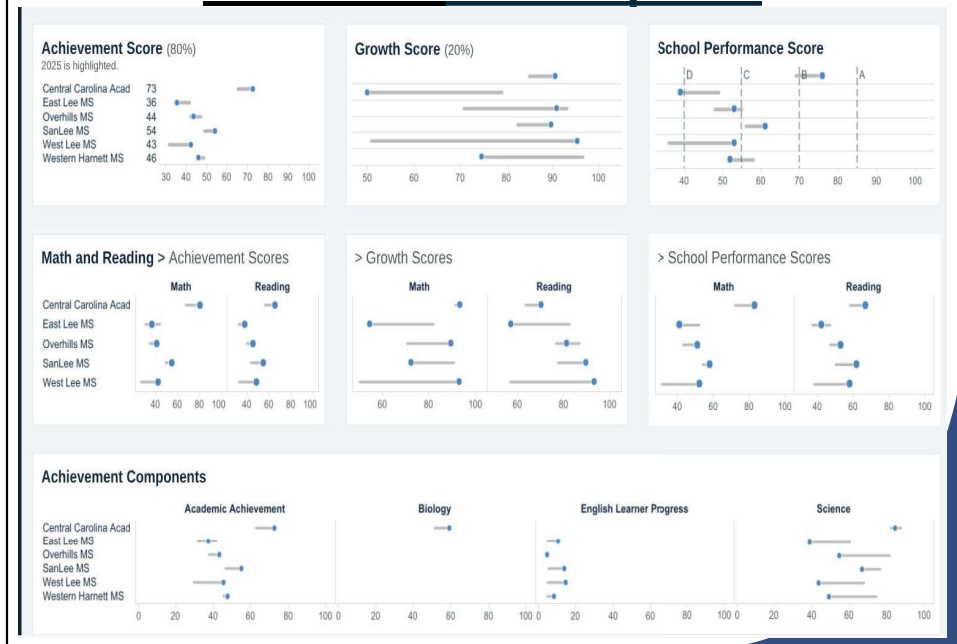
Schools like West Lee Middle and Overhills Middle also Exceeded, showing high performance similar to ours.

Others, like Highland Middle and Western Harnett Middle, Met growth, while several high schools are still Not Met.

What this table shows is that CCA is outperforming many regional peers, particularly in both overall grade and student growth.

It highlights the effectiveness of our instructional strategies and supports, as we are consistently helping students make measurable academic gains.

Area Middle School Comparison



This slide shows a detailed comparison of achievement and growth metrics for CCA and other area middle schools, based on the NC DPI School Performance Dashboard.

Overall School Performance Score: CCA earned a B with a score of 76, reflecting strong overall achievement compared to regional peers.

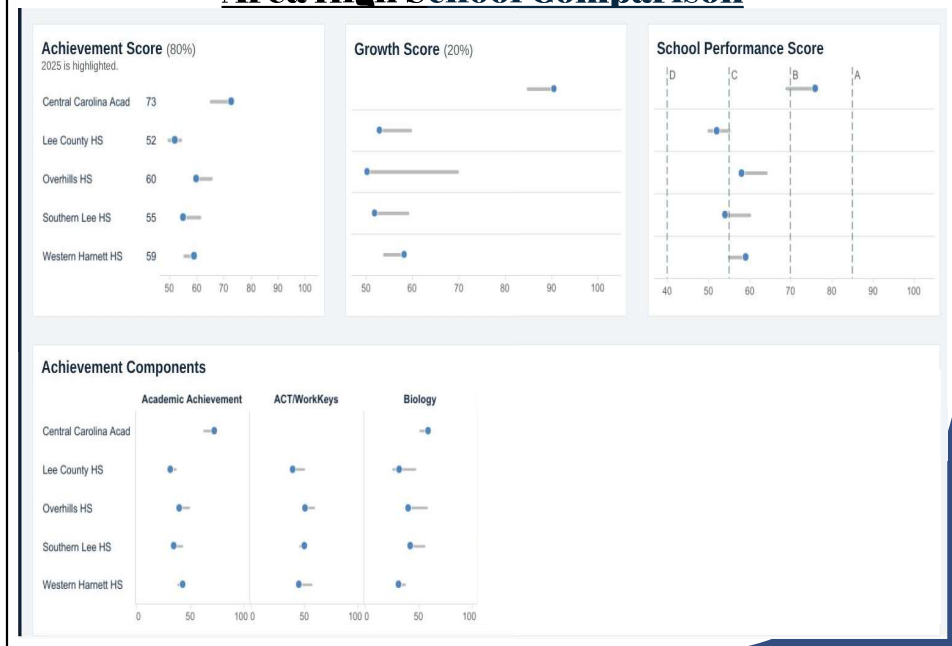
Achievement Scores: Our students are performing very well in both Math and Reading, with our achievement components consistently higher than many neighboring schools. This indicates that our instructional strategies are effectively supporting mastery of core skills.

Growth Scores: CCA is in the Exceeded growth category, showing that students are making progress beyond expectations. Many other middle schools in the area are only meeting growth, or in some cases, not meeting it.

Achievement Components: Looking closer, CCA's students are strong across the key subcategories measured—this further demonstrates consistent success in academic performance, readiness, and proficiency.

In summary, the data show that CCA is not only performing well in absolute terms but also driving meaningful growth, standing out as one of the stronger performing middle schools in the area.

Area High School Comparison



This slide provides a comparison of achievement and growth metrics for CCA's high school students and other area high schools, again using the NC DPI School Performance Dashboard.

Overall School Performance Score: Our high school students earned a D with a score of 52–58 across peer schools, with growth and achievement varying widely.

Achievement Scores: In both Math and Reading, some area high schools are struggling to meet proficiency, while others are showing moderate gains. This highlights the challenges high schools face in maintaining strong achievement across all content areas.

Growth Scores: CCA's growth continues to exceed expectations, particularly compared to many other high schools in the region, even when overall achievement scores are lower. This shows that our students are making meaningful academic progress over time.

Achievement Components: When we look at the subcategories of achievement, growth, and readiness, it's clear that schools performing at or below CCA's level have room for improvement, especially in Math and Reading proficiency.

In short, this comparison reinforces that CCA's focus on supporting student growth is effective, and even in areas where absolute achievement scores may appear lower, our students are advancing academically at a strong pace relative to peers.



These banners in our lobby and admin areas highlight CCA's growth over the past three years.

First year 2022–23: We met growth.

Economically Disadvantaged students are showing high growth and strong achievement, which demonstrates the effectiveness of our targeted supports and interventions.

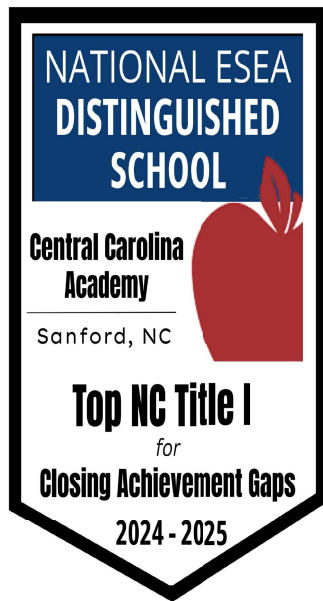
Hispanic students also have high growth and performance scores, reflecting the success of culturally responsive teaching and inclusive strategies.

This is our banner recognizing CCA as a National ESEA Distinguished School for the 2024–25 school year.

This award honors schools that are among the top Title I schools in their state for closing achievement gaps.

To earn this distinction, schools must meet several criteria:

A poverty rate of at least 35% (or the state's average if below 35%).

High academic achievement, which can include high academic growth.

Meeting or exceeding state accountability standards.

Participation in federally funded ESEA programs.

This award reflects that CCA is not only delivering strong academic results overall, but is successfully closing gaps for students who historically face the greatest challenges.

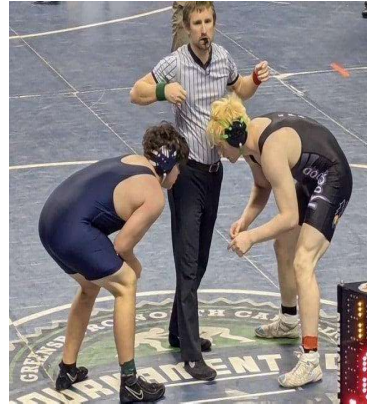

“Ejection Free School”



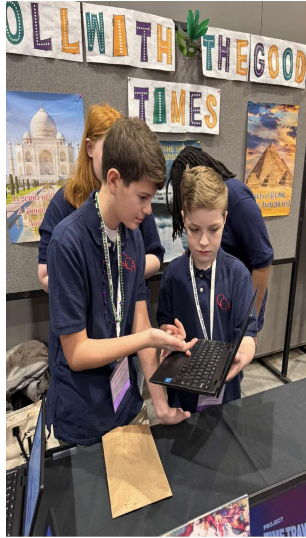
Central Carolina Academy has been recognized as an Ejection-Free School.

Amazing theater productions at CCA!

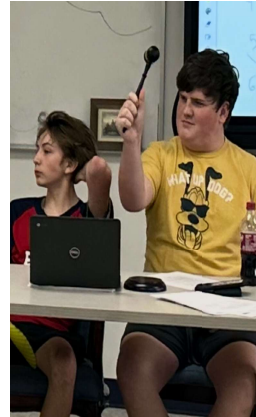
In our first year, students performed a Greek Mythology production, followed by The Little Mermaid last year, and this year's production is Robin Hood.

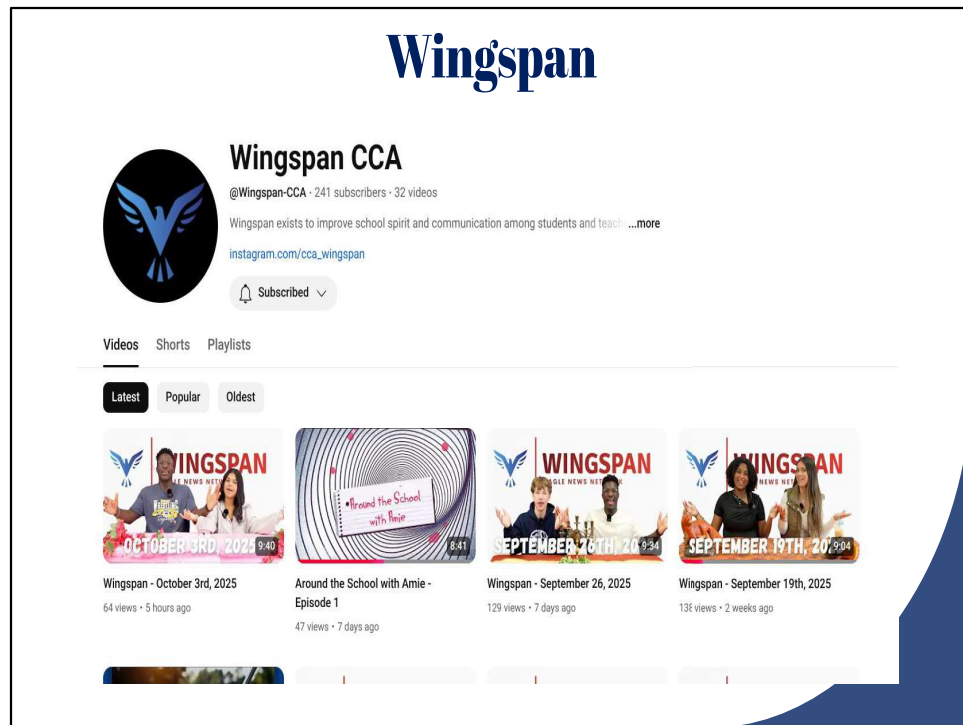
